- b. AWB Budget request the requested increase in legal and media campaign surrounding adjudication was reviewed. The increase would reduce our project budget but reserves are adequate to fill that need should it arise.

III. Ag Water Board/Water Supply

- a. Adjudication debate
 - Ecology report recommends Nooksack
 - Adjudication supported only by Tribes, Fishers, Realtors, and environmental
 - Building partnerships locally and in Olympia
 - Plan for Legislative education by Family Farmers.
- b. County Executive proposal
 - Built on Lummi proposal (2015) and Drainage Based Management
 - Seeking support from water users
 - Would add a new element to the Watershed Management Board's work plan "Settlement Negotiations". This will be advanced in lieu of adjudication.

IV. Drainage/Habitat/Flood

- a. Drainage concerns Kratzig corner still has issues but will have to wait until next year to evaluate.
- b. Beaver trapping Pete Smit is responsive to calls. At \$200/beaver our \$2500 budget should cover at least 10 beaver.
- c. Flood Committee update The Appel floodgate is in the plans but Rich wasn't too concerned about delaying it a few years in light of the adjudication challenge.

V. Water Quality

- a. Monitoring Results reviewed without incidents.
- b. DNA project Avian project initiated late year
- c. Manure ordinance Fred reported the County ordinance banning liquid manure spreading on open fields in the winter is judged superfluous. Updated state rules cover what this was intended to cover. There will be movement to rescind it.
- d. Wildlife working on removing some restrictions on hunting wildfowl in the winter months.

VI. Education/Communications

- b. Fall Newsletter unsure if we should invest the time and \$\$ to publish a printed version. Make more effort to alert landowners to the website. Send the adjudication paper and an invitation to receive emails for future electronic newsletters.
